Conditions in the forest

The late spring, the last ice disappeared a week ago, in combination with a wet autumn, makes us want to add some comments on the conditions in the terrain. In general, the forest has dried up well. Surface water lies on some marsches but not more than can be expected normal for the season. On the map there are a number of areas with the symbol rough open land, which is crossed by small crossable watercourses. Some of these open lands were drenched in water last autumn, but have dried up well. Some water remain on a few of the fields but not more than 10 centimetres (4 inches). The watercourses are also passable but in a few places, the water can reach the thighs. These open lands with watercourses mainly concern the longer courses of the 10MILA-relay.

Passage of pastures

On some of the longer courses of the 10MILA-relay, cattle pastures are crossed. Some of these pastures can only be crossed at the crossing point symbols (see picture). In the terrain, red/white bands mark these crossings. In one place on the map, the symbol impassable vegetation lies in direct connection to the crossing point. (see picture). Passage through this transition affected at all and the rough vegetation has been cleared.



Forbidden areas

In the new specification for orienteering maps (ISOM 2017), prohibited areas are marked with purple grids. Where the grid is solid, the border is marked by blue/yellow bands in the terrain. There are also some smaller marches forbidden to pass, but not marked as forbidden areas on the map. Blue/yellow bands in the terrain mark these marches.



Correction to published competition program

In the competition program published on the website and Eventor, wrong size of the map is printed for two of the courses. Course 3 and 6 in the 10MILA-relay will have A3 size and not A2 as is stated in the published program.
